History of Brisbane Water Ladies Golf Association (BWLGA)

CCWGA had its origins as a member of the Newcastle-Hunter District Ladies Golf Association which was formed in 1930 and included clubs from Gosford in the south, Singleton to the west and north to Bulahdelah.

The growth of the Central Coast clubs and playing members saw the formation of a separate District known as Brisbane Water Ladies Golf Association –BWLGA. Betty Clark, Ruth McPhan and Joan O'Connell were instrumental in working with NHDGA and we thank them for all their work and hope they would be proud of how our District has grown.

The Inaugural meeting of BWLGA took place at Tuggerah Lakes Golf Club on the 18th August 1980 with outcomes:

- District Colours of Green and Navy
- District Flag was presented by NSWLGU
- District AGM was held at Wyong Golf Club in 1981
- District Pennant Flags were presented in 1982
 - designed by Judy Margin of Gosford Golf Club
 - printed by Joan Watts of Wyong
- District logo revised in 1998 by Miss Kate Henry of Everglades

In 2006 the Central Coast region was officially granted regional status by the government and following this decision the **Central Coast Women's Golf Association Inc** was adopted.

Joan was a founding member of the District Committee in 1980 and has served continuously, holding numerous positions, including the Inaugural Captain. She was made a Life Member of CCWGA in 2001.

Joan also served on Club Committees at Gosford and Terrigal.

In addition to this Joan held positions at Golf NSW, (formerly NSWLGU), and is currently an Honorary Member of Golf NSW. She served on the Junior Match Committee, Finance Committee and was the Chairperson of the Course Ratings Committee for Golf NSW from 2001 to 2005.

Joan was a member of the Tournament Panel for Golf NSW and served as a Referee for Junior Tournaments representing Golf NSW.

Joan was awarded the Medal of the Order of Australia for her services to Golf on Australia Day 2017.

Judy Swanson



Judy joined the District Committee in 1990 as Vice President. She served as Secretary from 1992 to 2008 at a time when this role included the work of a captain.

Judy was also very involved with working with the Juniors at Shelly Beach and would often travel away on weekends to tournaments.

In addition, Judy was the district delegate to the GNSW Council for 4 years, during which time she served on the Course Rating Committee, spending a great deal of time travelling with Joan around the state.

Ellen started on the District Committee in 2004. She was District President from 2006 to 2009, and then took on the position of District Handicapper from 2009 to 2017.

Ellen was the Central Coast Delegate to NSW Golf Council from 2005 until 2016.

She was also very involved at Morisset Golf Club where she was an inaugural member, serving on the committee, often as President or Captain, for almost all of its 50 years, as well as serving on the Board.

Ellen was awarded an OAM in 2014.

Ruth McPhan



Ruth was a member of the Inaugural District Committee. She served continuously on the committee in various roles including Secretary, Vice President and President.

Ruth became a CCWGA Counsellor in 1997 and served until 2015.

Betty Clark



Betty was the Inaugural President of the District Committee in 1981 to 1985. She also served as Treasurer from 1986 -1988.

Betty then became a CCWGA Counsellor from 1991 to 2013

Mollie began her long association with this District in 1980 when she was elected District Handicapper to the inaugural committee. She soon after had to resign as the family was transferred out of the district.

When she returned, Mollie served on the committee for 20 years, 19 of them as Handicapper, a remarkable achievement considering there were no computers for a lot of this time.

Mollie has maintained her involvement in the District and became a District Counsellor in 2015 which converted to **Life Member in 2020**.

Di took on her first role on the District in 2003 and continued until 2014. Di filled a number of positions during this time including that of Vice President from 2004-06, Secretary 2009-2011 and District Captain from 2012-2014.

Di became a District Counsellor in 2016 which converted to **Life Member in 2020** and continues to assist the District in many ways.

Club Histories

Breakers Golf Club (Est 1966 as Terrigal)

Plans for a golf course at Terrigal began as early as 1964. A hardworking group of volunteers, many of whom were members of the RSL, gave freely of their time to establish a small club house in 1966. Land nearby was gradually cleared from garbage dumps, impenetrable forest areas and swamps. Help with clearing work was also received from Mt Penang boys' Training School.



By 1974, Terrigal Memorial Country Club had been formed, Mr Bobby Knox designed and supervised the construction of a 9 hole golf course, challenging to A graders and interesting to C graders. The course opened with three Par 3s, played 3 times each for a nine hole comp and by 1976 both ladies and men had affiliated with District and State Associations. We still have a number of Life Members whose voluntary work in these early days is very much appreciated.

The course developed slowly in the early years and was often closed due to the flooding caused in part by overflowing creeks, a high water table and lack of grass. However, in recent years a great deal of time and money has been spent on drainage and watering systems and this is now a very rare event.



Breakers Golf Club



A new club house was established in 1998 and our golf club is one of several sub clubs now under the umbrella of Breakers Country Club.

Since then, we have gone from strength to strength with further development of the golf course.

New greens on 1st and 8th are the first in a planned upgrade of all 9 greens. We also have a new 1st tee and, of course, Breakers club continues to expand and develop, providing multiple dining options every day and numerous meeting areas.

We continue to have at least 130 financial lady members with about 80 ladies regularly enjoying the easy walk, challenging holes and wonderful friendships that are readily available at Breakers. You will also find many of us keen to visit other clubs to test ourselves on different courses and meet new ladies. Thank you to the District for providing so many of these opportunities.



Everglades Golf Club

Everglades Est 1958

Everglades Golf Club began in November 1958 with a tin shed and a nine hole sand belt course. All the players held 36 handicaps. With so much water on the course the 'local rule' was that if a player hit to the water a ball could be dropped on the other side.

Being such a tight difficult course Everglades, over the years, has produced many fine golfers who have been selected to play for NSW and Australia.

The club always struggled to field a team in C.N.D.G.A. Being the most southern club in the Hunter region meant a good 8 hr day travel & golf for our players and we were pleased at the idea of a local district. When B.W.A.G.A began in 1980 Mesdames Muriel Hannan and Irene Quintrell were members of the inaugural Committee. The Muriel Hannan Salver is still played for today.

The smaller district and less travel meant that Everglades were able to field more players in Pennants. Our golfers have been proud to win quite a few Pennants & to take out the Margin Shield on more than one occasion.

Everglades was the 1st club in the district to have full membership for women. We have representation on the greens Committee and women have been elected to our Board of Directors.

Being a Country Club we provide both Golf, Bowls and many social activities. The land is owned by the club and it's members.

With the introduction of fairway watering there have been big changes to our course; we now have a fully renovated club house, a new Pro Shop with Mr Darren Chivas as our Professional.

Gosford Golf Club

Gosford Golf Club Est 1928

Gosford course was originally a 3 hole course at Jusfrute Park West Gosford before being extended to 9 holes in the early 1930's. The course was moved to Victoria Park, Gosford in 1933 after land was handed back from the Forestry Department and a 9 hole course and clubhouse was built. The layout remained the same until 1950 when the club negotiated with the Lands Dept and Gosford Council for a lease of land and the course was able to be extended to 18 holes. The original clubhouse had three major extensions and in 1967 GC was able to purchase land for a new clubhouse adjacent to the existing one and in 1971-72 a new clubhouse was built. This clubhouse had renovations and extensions in 1980 and in 2005 major renovations and extensions which exist today. In 1985 the course underwent major changes in layout and since then fairway watering has been installed and works done to improve the drainage.

2003 saw the club celebrate its 75th Year. Celebrations included a Dinner Dance and display of memorabilia in the club. The ladies also celebrated the occasion with a special golf day and luncheon. The club also celebrated its 90th year in 2018 with a dinner and it looks forward to celebrating its Centenary in 2028.

The number of ladies members at the club has dropped significantly over the years from 362 in 1980, 265 in 2000 to 140 in 2020. The club has held Rookie programmes over the last few years and these are proving popular and many involved in the programmes are going on to join the club.

Gosford holds ladies competitions on Tuesdays and Thursdays and although numbers have decreased over the years currently there are normally between 60-75 players on a Tuesday and 25-40 on a Thursday. Ladies are also able to play in competitions on a Friday, Saturday and Sunday. Visitors are welcome to join our competitions on most days. Annually the club also holds a Ladies Open Day, Invitation Day and Gosford Bowl, Salver and Long Markers events. The ladies committee and social committee put in a lot of extra work to ensure the success of these days.

Gosford ladies are also very keen to play in various events run by the State and District including the Pennant competition run by CCWGA. Over the years ladies from our club have had many successes.

The club is very proud of the achievements of its only female Life Member Marea Parsons. Marea represented NSW and Australia multiple times as well as winning many titles. Marea has won the Australian, New Zealand and South African Championships and was awarded GGC Life Membership.



Kooindah Waters Golf Club

THE HISTORY OF KOOINDAH WATERS

Built upon what was once an air strip,

Kooindah Waters commenced development in 2005. Named after the area's local Indigenous word for 'clear water', it was officially opened in early 2006. Kooindah Waters is built on natural wetlands and is home to a plethora of birdlife such as black swans, spoonbills, egrets, herons, swamp hens to name a few. Whilst the beautiful surroundings make for pleasant viewing, it is a challenge to keep your balls dry.



Back in the beginning, the club looked very different to how it does today. The pro shop and licenced cafe were set up in temporary shipping containers and were positioned where the existing Day Spa facility is located.

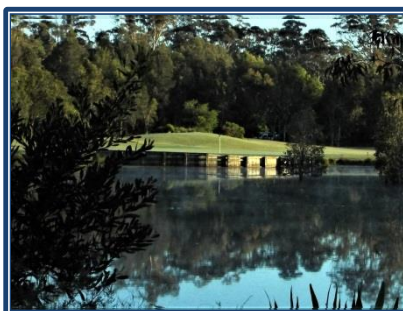
The first fairway that was laid was the 10th, followed by the 15th. The first 9 holes were constructed on the area previously known as the old Strathaven golf course.

Kooindah Waters' first competition was held on Saturday October 2, 2006, when 14 players (both men and women) christened the course, many of whom had never played the game before. It took a further two more years before the club was able to be registered and develop a membership program.

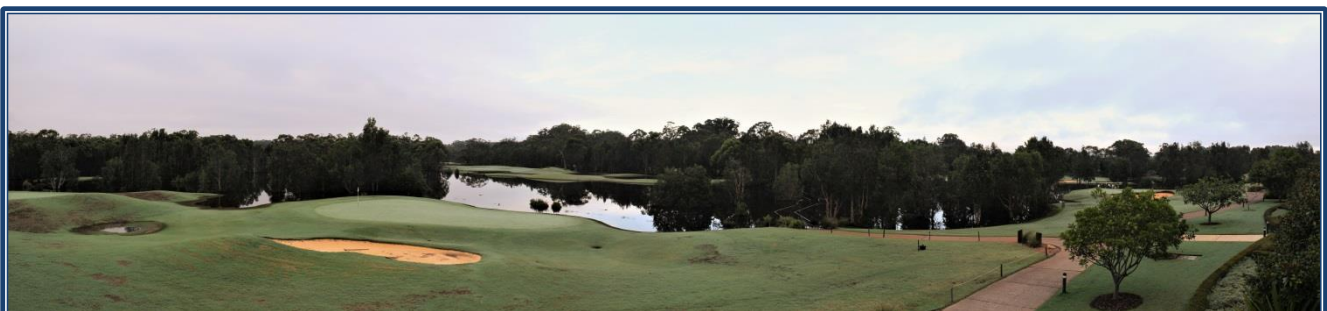
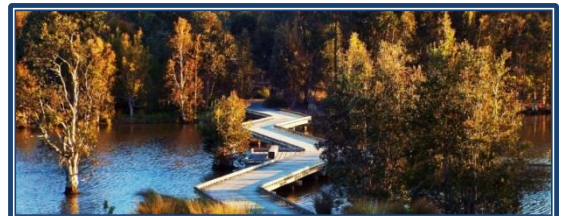
The first Ladies Pennant team enrolled to play in the CCWGA district competition in 2010, and have fielded a team every year since our inauguration. As of April 2020, Kooindah Waters has over 670 club members.

The club has grown in popularity since its inception and the annual Ladies Open Day has gone from strength to strength. The camaraderie at KW is highlighted by the Silver Foxes (male members) who meet, greet and porter for the visiting ladies which assists the event to run smoothly.

The district committee were most helpful during the early stages of setting up the ladies golf at Kooindah Waters. A huge thank you to all of them for their hard work in creating an executive who has enhanced women's golf on the Central Coast. Best wishes and good luck for the next 40 years.

Magenta Shores Golf and Country Club

Magenta the suburb was an imaginative concept conceived by Mirvac Group, a publicly listed developer and hotelier, in 2003. The idea was to develop 100 hectares of national park and wasteland. The land acquisition was finalised in 2004 with a payment of \$40 million to the Darkinjung Aboriginal Land Council. The plan proposed development of approximately 500 residential properties, a hotel resort complex capable of accommodating 200 guests and a quality golf course.

The Company engaged renowned course designer Ross Watson to design the course, which takes up an area of approximately 50 hectares, and was built at a cost of \$13 million. The course is built partly on wasteland, is entirely sand based and designed as a links style course. It provides a strong challenge for every level of golfer. Initially the course was very difficult but over time it has become much more playable whilst retaining its high scratch and slope ratings. Today the course retains its ranking in the top 40 within Australia.



A feature of Magenta Shores is that it is gender neutral, enshrined in the Club's Constitution, and consequently club events are mixed competitions. The Men's Captain and Ladies Captain are elected annually by all members, and they work together with the Match Committee to organise what events are run and when. This committee is equally represented with both men and women. There is also a social committee to help with the more social events. Magenta is a very social club, helped by the fact that many members live at Magenta.



The first competition round was played on Saturday 6th August 2006. The club currently runs weekly competitions on Wednesday, Saturday, and Sunday. Members can book into these competitions on-line up to a month in advance, and can play with whoever they like. "Fun" events are also run during the year, occasionally on a Saturday, but there are also Nine & Dine's and Nine Hole Par 3 competitions.

Magenta Shores Golf and Country Club



Magenta Shores first competed in the annual district Men's and Ladies Pennants in 2007. The men came away with successes in B grade in 2008 and 2010 and C grade in 2009. Our ladies won Division 2 in 2011. The club has also had a very successful Super Seniors Men's team over the last few years, and the Men's Master Pennants team is very competitive. In the last couple of years the Club has started a junior program, and it is hoped that this will encourage younger players to play golf on a more regular basis.

The Club owns a fully equipped gymnasium, indoor swimming pool and tennis courts, and all Club Magenta members whether residents of Magenta or not, are able to access these facilities.



The Club currently has more than 600 members, and including the golf course itself, has always been totally owned and controlled by its members and overseen by its Board, of whom five out of eight are elected golfing Members. The day-to-day operations are outsourced to Magenta Golf Management Pty Ltd, and this arrangement is managed by the Board.

Morriset Golf Club

Much has changed since the beginning of our club in 1968. After the first years of struggling to get it to a playable condition we can now be proud to say our course is undoubtedly one of the finest in the district.

Originally the introduction of the slope rating in 2015 gave some cause for concern as we were given a low rating of 117. After a lot of work on our Captain's part this was amended to a more acceptable 120 in 2018.

2018 was an important milestone as this was our 50th year which we celebrated in style.

Each year in February we have held a "Friendship Day". This has been a very successful way to recruit new members with each team on the day bringing along a beginner.

We have been fortunate to have over 20 members in their 80's still playing, many of whom were still able to walk the course. Our patroness Beryl Mullard, who was instrumental in the formation of the club, was playing on a regular basis and is now over 90.

Our ladies have been very dedicated to the Club and have worked tirelessly to keep all running smoothly, for example our present Captain, Ellen Rae, has held a position in the club from it's commencement. Ellen was awarded an OAM for her work with golf and we are all very proud of her and her achievement.

The Club has produced some excellent players over the years. Most recently Louise Mullard has been achieving great success in both state and national contests. She began playing here in the early days of the club when she was very young.

It has been pleasing to have Belinda Diamond, another of our success stories, back home again. She has been filling a different role on the coaching side as a professional, working alongside our head pro Dave Stretton.

Our ladies have been very proud of their success in the Pennants games and have taken out the prestigious Margin Shield on several occasions.

Sadly in May 2019 the time came to say goodbye to Morisсет Country Club, as the owner decided to close the Club. This included all facilities, buildings and recreation areas. Understandably we were all deeply shocked and saddened by his decision.

We wish you all the very best for the future and thank you for your friendship over the years.

Name Change: In 2011 Tuggerah Lakes was renamed Shelly Beach.

We presently have on average 100+ ladies playing each Wednesday our main ladies day. With 50 – 60+ on our second day which is Monday.

Upwards of 220 ladies are golfing members.

A new course layout was trailed three years ago, after the trial period finished the members voted to return to the original layout.

In 2011 The ninth hole was redesigned mainly due to safety reasons. Jan Stephenson was invited to hit the first ball on the day the hole reopened.

The club house has recently had extensive renovations with more to come in the future.

Our 'Tyro's program has been very successful bringing lots of ladies to the game of golf.

Shelly ladies have had great success over the years at Pennants. Winning the Margin Shield four times as Tuggerah Lakes and four times as Shelly Beach.

Our ladies have been regional winners twice in the last few years at the Holden Scramble (now the Volkswagen Scramble) with our Pro Jason Hart.

Over the last 10 years our first charity day of the year has raised over \$30,000 for the Oncology Unit at Gosford Hospital and similar amounts has been raised for various local charities on our second charity day of the year.

Shelly Beach Golf Club



Nikki Garrett, Cathy Neilson (now Stoltz) and Jan Stephenson all former Tuggerah Lakes members went on to turn professional with great success. Jan in 2019 was inducted into World Golf Hall of Fame.

Kim Burke a long-time member and 16 times Club Champion, 11 times District Champion of Champions and 6 times District Foursomes Champion. Kim has achieved so many golfing glory moments too many for this booklet and still has the same enthusiasm for golf today.

In 2018 Kim Burke became a Lady Patroness of Shelly Beach and in 2019 her great friend and another long serving member of Shelly Beach (and Tuggerah Lakes) Jenny Abrahams became our newest Lady Patroness.



Toukley Golf Club

From 2000 – 2020 Toukley's membership has grown to 920. We are frequently described as the friendliest club on the Central Coast and quite justifiably as a highly-rated championship course, winning the right to host the NSW PGA Touring Players' Championship for five years. At the successful inaugural event in 2005, the title winner Ricky Schmidt was quoted as saying that the Toukley layout had earned the respect and admiration of all the professionals, while Tournament Coordinator Darren Quint reportedly agreed, describing the course as a "jewel".

These comments can be attributed to our hard-working volunteers and green staff. Our full-time greenkeeper numbers have increased from 5 to 8 over recent years giving Toukley the highest number of fulltime greenkeepers on the Central Coast. Our volunteer regiment of members, continue to improve the course each year with the rebuilding of tees, greens, raising of fairways as well as the general aesthetic appeal of the course. The club has also invested in 16.5km of underground drainage, meaning our course is very rarely unplayable.

In 2005 the club invested \$600,000 into a water saving retention scheme that saves water off the streets, carpark and from the club house. This water is used for our fairway watering system meaning we have "play the ball as it lies" most of the year.

We have a total of 3 cart storage sheds that house 90 carts with the breakdown of 75 members, and 25 owned by the club.

Currently there are in total 160 lady members with on average 70 ladies playing in the 18 hole ladies competition on Tuesdays and 15 -20 playing in the 9 hole competition, with our numbers increasing each year. The increase in numbers partly comes from our Angels program that the women run in conjunction with the pro shop. This program has been running for 15years. 100+ ladies have been Angels, with many now playing in our weekly 18 hole competitions. Thelma Hogg was our first Angels volunteer and due to her dedication to Toukley, was nominated and received Life Membership in 2007.

Another contributing factor to the growth of Toukley ladies can be attributed to Yvonne Boardman's huge contribution, guidance and leadership of the ladies. She has been a member of the club since 1986, has held many long term positions on the committee, has played off scratch, our Club Champion for 12 of the last 20 years and is currently the CCWGA District Captain.

Over the years Toukley Ladies have won several prestigious events. In 2009 Toukley won the Golf NSW Women's Bronze Medallion. The team consisted of Judy Dind, Dot Beard, Di O'Meara and Paula Randy and was played at Concord and Cumberland Golf Clubs. Toukley is the only club on the Central Coast to have won this award in the last 20 years.

Our next 2 accolades were in more recent years. In 2018 Toukley were thrilled when Narelle Tracey won 2nd Division Mabel McKenzie Brooch and thrilled again in 2019 with Beth Bjorkbom winning the 3rd Division Brooch. The Mabel McKenzie brooch is a NSW Ladies Vets stroke competition where each club from across NSW submit their best qualifying divisional cards with the winner being the best score in each Division. Congratulations to all of these ladies and the 3 outstanding accolades for Toukley Golf Club.

Wyang Ladies golf continues to evolve into 2020.



Major renovations at the club were undertaken between 2001-2004 which involved a new Pro Shop and extension to the Member's lounge. The Auditorium was refurbished and a refashioned club entry/administration area was included.

In 2009 Wyong Golf Club celebrated its 75th Anniversary. In the October of that year Wyong Ladies celebrated with an Open Day with 196 ladies teeing off. President Ruth McPhan and Captain Robyn Murray cut a celebratory cake on the day.

2012 saw the construction of two new greens (15th & 18th). These greens were designed by Wayne Grady. Most bunkers were upgraded and resurfaced along with new drainage on 3 greens.

Ruth McPhan and Betty Clark were pioneers of Ladies Golf at Wyong and also the CCWGA (known as BWLGA). Betty Clark was president at Wyong Golf Club for 12 years, she passed away in 2016. Ruth held the positions of Captain for 9 years and President for 12 years. Ruth passed away in 2014. We still benefit from their contributions to ladies golf both at the club and district level.

Our Ladies Singles Championship was dominated by Amanda Hapoka 2001-2006 and Erica Bond from 2007-2013.

The Wyong Ladies saw a decline in membership in recent years. However with the untimely closure of the Morisset Club our membership increased with 40 new ladies joining. The experience and contribution they bring to Wyong Ladies Golf will benefit us in future years.

In 2018 the Wyong Ladies Classic and Long Markers Shield had its 25th Anniversary. A new course record of 73 was set by Kim Burke of Shelly Beach Ladies Golf Club.

Mangrove Mountain Golf Club

Mangrove Mountain Golf Club was established in 1972 and the Ladies Golf Committee was formed in 1986. At this time there were 10 Associate members with an average of 5 playing each week. After the new clubhouse was opened in 1991 membership numbers grew. Regular competitions then had 11 to 17 ladies competing.

Unfortunately at the 2014 AGM no positions were filled (one person can't do it all!), and the Mangrove Mountain Ladies Golf Committee no longer existed.

Competitions were run by the Pro Shop for almost 12 months after this, but with only 2 or 3 ladies playing each Tuesday. Our club has always struggled to keep Lady members as the course is considered too tough, however our Ladies have achieved great results over the years. A couple of ladies have had a Hole in One and Nikki Ward had an Albatross.

Mangrove won the Districts 20th and 30th Anniversary competitions and also won the Gwen Thompson Shield four times. We have been State finalists in the WGNWS 3BBB Competition 3 times, winning the final in 1995. Our Mangrove team were also State finalists in the WG Holden Teams event in 1995.

There have been quite a few winners at the District Championships Days over the years with Nikki Yorke's (Ward) District Champion win in 2005 being the best.

Winning the Grade 3 Pennant in 1998 was a highlight and we celebrated well. Annette and Nicole Ward have both been honoured with Life Membership of the Club, which is much appreciated.

Sadly but true a lot of good things come to an end!

Congratulations to the District on its success over the past 40 years and good wishes for the future.
